The sorors of Eta Omega Omega Chapter are pleased to present Soror Joy Elaine Daley, International Regional Director, as a potential candidate for the office of First Supreme Anti-Basileus.

Soror Daley was initiated into the Xi Xi chapter at Lehman College in 1985. She later served as the 10th President of Eta Omega Omega Chapter. Under her leadership, the chapter began the longest running service project, "AKATEEN Rites of Passage for Girls". She also founded the chapter's not-for-profit organization, Wheeler, Wilson and Johnson Community Projects, Incorporated and served as its first President.

On the regional level, Ms. Daley served as Sergeant-at-Arms, Assistant Parliamentarian, Awards Committee Co-Chairman, Logistics Chairman and Regional Conference Co-chairman. She also served as the Chairman of the North Atlantic Regions Nominating Committee and was appointed Chairman of the International Nomination Committee. She was elected the 30th North Atlantic Regional Director in 2002 leading the region into the new millennium with a strong emphasis on being timely, accountable and fiscally responsible. Soror Joy created the first Regional Treasury in the history of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated to ensure excess funds were used to subsidize regional expenditures and avoid assessing members.

Currently, Ms. Daley serves as the 9th International Regional Director, supervising all of the sorority's chapters outside of continental USA. Throughout the pandemic, Soror Joy created the Global Pen Pal program to keep international members engaged and offer an opportunity for international members to know sorors statewide. She is also the Chairman for the Pandemic Task Force.

Eta Omega Omega Chapter supports the nomination of Soror Joy Elaine Daley for First Supreme Anti-Basileus. A vote was taken at our regular sorority meeting held on June 11, 2021, and Soror Joy received a favorable vote.
